

Douglas Fir

(Pseudotsuga menziesii)

Firs are trees of superb form, with straight trunks and regular tiers of whorled branches.

Douglas Fir is a medium to fast growing tree that does best in moist, well-drained soils, reaching 60 feet in height at maturity. It is the largest timber producing tree in North America. Its' symmetrical form and small, flattened, soft needles 3/4" to 1-1/2" long which are retained well, making it an excellent Christmas tree species. Other uses include wind breaks, and food and cover for various wildlife.
